From 1st January 1970 to October 31, 2014, Prof. Pecorelli performed and participated in **6961 major** surgical procedures, of which **3,761** were oncological cases.

#### NATIONAL APPOINTMENTS

### At the University of Brescia:

- Chairman of the Research Council (2006-2010); he started the idea of integrating different schools (Medicine, Engineering, Economics, Law) with programs aimed at a social fall out. This idea was later developed to change the mission of the University, leading to theme of Health and Wealth in the environment.
- Member of the Academic Senate (2006-2010).
- President of the School of Obstetrics (2006-2012).
- Chairman of the Scientific Committee of the Center for Technology Transfer (CSMT). The Committee was made of opinion leaders in the field, ranging from Medicine to Engineering Technology and Economics. It developed a strategic plan in different areas of expertise.

### At the Italian Ministry of Health:

• 2009-2015: President of the management board of AIFA, the Italian Regulatory Agency for Medicines.

With Director General Guido Rasi (today executive director of EMA, European medicine Agency ) he implemented and **deeply reformed the Agency** introducing new concepts for the sustainability of the drug system (cost sharing, risk sharing, drug registries and use of HTA).

He was instrumental for the internationalization of the Agency outside Europe, particularly in relation to common areas of interest with the U.S. FDA.

- 2004-2007: Chair of the Italian National Committee for Cancer Prevention.
- 2001-2013 **Member of the Board of Trustees** of the Italian National Institutes of Health (Istituto Superiore di Sanità).
- Member of the Scientific Committee of the Italy-USA Agreement for Cancer Research. This
  agreement was signed in June 2003 and constituted the first agreement between the two
  Countries, providing funds for 50 million euros. It generated 82 patents in the field of
  Oncology and Biotechnology. More than 100 fellows, PhD students and Post Doc. spent at

- least one year at N.I.H. and George Mason University. The agreement produced 328 scientific papers in 8 years.
- 1994-2006: Member of the **National Oncology Committee** of the Ministry of Health and Coordinator of the Scientific Committee for the Oncology Prevention during the Italian Presidency of the European Union in 2003, with the approval of the European law for Cancer Screening (Cervix, Breast, and Colon Cancers).
- He was Member of the National Center for Disease Control and Head of the National Committee on Prevention of Cancer of CCM.

#### SCIENTIFIC ACTIVITY

His scientific activity is almost entirely devoted to female cancer and to the implementation of both primary and secondary prevention actions, with more than 300 published scientific papers and high volume clinical activity.

He devoted most of his professional activity to pelvic cancer surgery, with original contributions in the field of conservative surgery for ovarian neoplasms and to primary and secondary prevention in medicine.

- He is the P.I. of the First 1000 days of Life Project, studying the interactions between lifestyles, environment and human genome during pregnancy and the first 2 years of life.
- He is author of 303 scientific papers, most of them published in important journals (e.g. Nature, New England Journal of Medicine, The Lancet, Cancer, Cancer Research, International Journal of Virology, British Medical Journal, European Journal of Cancer); 21 book chapters and 4 books.
- He was the Principal Investigator in three important studies looking at the role of surgery both in early (ACTION trial) and in advanced ovarian cancers and at conservative surgery in early ovarian cancer.
- He was the senior author (NEJM) of the paper demonstrating the benefit of surgery (Interval Debulking) in ovarian cancer.
- He participated in the first Phase II-III trials for HPV Vaccines.
- He was involved in many translational research projects, some of which aiming at the production of therapeutic vaccines for cervix and ovary cancers.
- He was the P.I. of the proteomic project on ovarian cancer within the agreement between the Italian and the US governments. (2003-2015)
- He is the initiator and P.I. of the First 1,000days Project, (launched at Mount Sinai School of Medicine in NYC in May 2017) studying the interactions between lifestyles, environment and human genome during pregnancy and the first 2 years of life, with attention also to the preconception period in both parents. This was also presented in plenary session at the Global Wellness Summits 2017 and 2018, suggesting the important positive role of the Wellness world for early prevention of Non-Communicable Diseases.
